



Development Trust AGM celebrates tennis court refurb

Backing from the Awards for All Lottery Fund and donations from the local community allowed the Tighnabruaich District Development Trust and Kyles Athletic to move forward with the upgrade of the community tennis court. With markings for football, tennis and shinty the facility will help play its part in keeping the community active and bringing on the shinty stars of the future.



The £27,600 project was completed in time to see the retirement of George Watson as chair of the Development Trust at this year's AGM. George was a long-time advocate for improving the tennis court - volunteering many hours on maintenance as well as fundraising. The new surface is a fitting tribute to George's six years as chair of TDDT in which the Trust also maintained the jetty at the Lifeboat Station; improved the local path network; introduced the VETS Emergency Telephone System and defibrillators situated throughout the parish; funded the new bus and car park improvements for Kyles Athletic; supplied new IPads for pupils at the Primary School; provided homework support for the kids in Dunoon Grammar Hostel and many other projects. TDDT are grateful for George's efforts over the years and for the work of the Treasurer, Graeme Hogg, and Andy Trull who also stepped down as trustees.

A big thank you is extended to the Cowal community for helping make 2023 an excellent year for raising funds for the RNLI.


